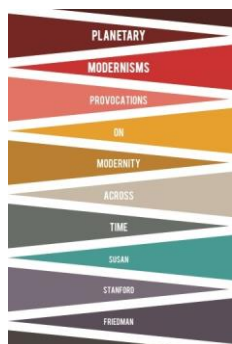


PROF. DR. SUSAN STANFORD FRIEDMAN

**Hilldale Professor in the Humanities and Virginia Woolf Professor of English and Women's Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where she has directed the Institute for Research in the Humanities since 2007.** Her fields include modernist studies, feminist studies, narrative theory, migration and diaspora studies, psychoanalysis, religious studies, archipelagic and oceanic studies. She was awarded the Wayne C. Booth Lifetime Award for Achievement in Narrative Studies by the International Society for the Study of Narrative (2009). She co-founded and edited the award-winning journal *Contemporary Women's Writing* (Oxford UP).

Her publications include **Planetary Modernisms: Provocations on Modernity Across Time** (Columbia UP 2015), **Mappings: Feminism and the Cultural Geographies of Encounter** (Princeton UP 1998), *Penelope's Web: Gender, Modernity, H.D.'s Fiction* (Cambridge UP 1990), and *Psyche Reborn: The Emergence of H.D.* (Indiana UP 1989). Edited or co-edited volumes include *Analyzing Freud: Letters of H.D., Bryher, and Their Circle* (New Directions 2001), **Comparison: Theories, Uses, Approaches** (Johns Hopkins UP 2013), *Joyce: The Return of the Repressed* (Cornell UP 1992), and *Signets—Reading H.D.* (U of Wisconsin P 1990). She has served as president of the Modernist Studies Association and the International Society for Narrative Studies. Her work has been translated into ten languages. Work in progress includes **Sisters of Scheherazade: Religion, Diaspora, Women's Writing** and the edited volume **Contemporary Revolutions: Turning Back to the Future in 21st Century Literature and Art.**
